Instructions for Holiday Homework

- 1. Holiday homework for English, Hindi, Maths, Science and Social Science is an INTEGRATED ASSIGNMENT. The topic/theme for the assignment is "ISRO & ITS CONTRIBUTION". The Holiday Homework for these five subjects should be done in a SINGLE SCRAPBOOK.
- 2. Use your creativity to decorate your scrapbook based on the theme.
- 3. Holiday Homework for remaining subjects shall be done as per the instructions given along with each subject.

A. <u>ENGLISH</u>

1. Imagine you are Kalpana Chawla. Write a letter to your friend describing your struggle to become an astronaut, your time at ISRO and your achievements.

(Refer to the chapter - An Indian American in Space: Kalpana Chawla. Honeysuckle Class VI)

2. BBC Compacta - Module 2, Page 81.

You recently met a celebrity. Write a diary entry describing who you met, where and how, what you said to each other or did with each other and how you felt about the experience.

B. <u>HINDI</u>

- 5. ISRO as a role model for the world in the field of astronomy

Procedure

a) Practice -
