## MATHEMATICS :

### A. **Project** : “Ink-Blot & Creative Art” – Create Your Own Symmetry\*

Task: Make symmetrical art and learn the math behind it as follows:

1. Ink-blot Monsters: Put paint drops on one side of paper, fold it, press. Open to see symmetrical art. Make 4 monsters and draw lines of symmetry.
2. Nature Symmetry: Find 3 leaves or flowers. Trace them, fold to check lines of symmetry. Paste dried leaves if possible.
3. Design a “Symmetrical School Logo” for The Asian School. How many lines of symmetry does it have? Why did you choose the design?
4. Reflection: write at least 5 lines on “Why is symmetry useful in design and nature?”

### B. **WORKSHEET**: Solve the holiday homework worksheet based on the chapters: Patterns in Mathematics, Prime Time. Worksheet will be shared in your class WhatsApp group.

#### Instructions:

- Holiday homework has to be done in the Mathematics Practice Register. Write a project report in neat and legible handwriting. Create Symmetrical Art designs on A4 size plain sheets and paste in the practice register.
- Paste a print out of the worksheet and solve in detail.
- You can use drawings, photos, craft, or computer printouts. Be creative and neat.

## SCIENCE:

### 1. **Observation Activity – Nature Observation Journal**

Observe any 5 plants or insects around your home/locality and record:

- Name
- Place where seen
- One special feature
- Sketch/Paste picture

### 2. **Water Evaporation Activity**

Aim: To observe how sunlight affects evaporation.

Materials Required:

- 2 bowls
- Water

#### Procedure:

1. Fill both bowls with equal amounts of water.
2. Keep one bowl in sunlight and the other in shade.

3. Observe the water level daily for 3–4 days.
4. Record your observations.

**Conclusion:**

Sunlight increases the rate of evaporation.

**C. Creative Task**

- Prepare a chart/model on: Components of Food.

**Instructions :**

- Complete the work neatly and creatively.
- Use an activity file/notebook wherever required.
- Students must do the work independently.
- Decorate your work with colours, drawings and labels.

**SOCIAL SCIENCE :**

**Model Making:**

1. Make a globe using a ball and paper mache. Mark the Equator, Prime Meridian, Tropic of Cancer, Tropic of Capricorn, Arctic Circle, Antarctic Circle.

**2. 3D Model:**

In a shoebox, make a model showing 4 major landforms - Mountain, Plateau, Plain, Desert. Use clay, sand, cotton, and paint. Label each.

Scrapbook Page: Paste pictures of 1 famous mountain, 1 plateau, 1 plain, and 1 desert in India. Write 2 lines on how people live there.

Eg: Thar Desert – People wear light cotton clothes and rear camels.

**3. World Map Project"**

**World Map:** On a chart paper, draw/outline the world map. Color and label all 7 continents and 5 oceans.

**Fun Facts Table:** Make a table with 2 interesting facts for each continent. Eg: Asia – Largest continent, Has Mt. Everest.

**4. Ocean Quiz: Write answers:**

- a. Which is the largest ocean?
- b. Which ocean is named after a country?
- c. Which continent is also a country?

**Activity 1: My Place on Earth – Geo Tag Project**

**Make a Geo Tag Page:** On an A4 sheet, paste a screenshot of your house from Google Maps showing the location pin and coordinates.
