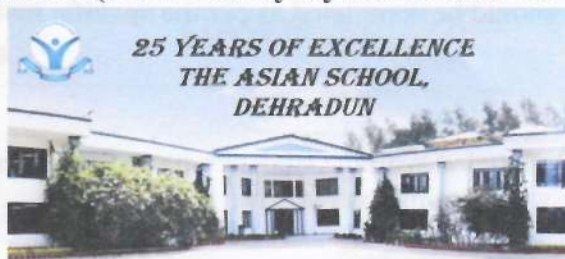

Dear Students and Parents,

Summer holidays are not just a break from school — they are a chance to explore, create, discover and grow! This holiday homework is a small learning adventure designed to keep young minds active, curious and creative while still enjoying the fun of vacation.

Complete each task with imagination, neatness and honesty. Remember to balance study time with play, reading, family moments and outdoor activities. Parents are encouraged to support and inspire children as they learn independently and confidently.

Learn, laugh, create and make this summer meaningful and memorable!

Note: Use a single scrapbook for all subjects except Art Education.

Here are practical points for parents and children to follow for Holiday Homework so it stays productive without stressing out summer:

For Children

1. Set a daily routine: Do 30-45 min of HHW each morning when the mind is fresh, then play.
2. Break it into parts: Don't do it all at once. Tackle one subject or one activity per day.
3. Ask, don't copy: If stuck, ask for help. Understanding matters more than finishing fast.
4. Add your own touch: Use creativity in charts, drawings, models. Make it yours.
5. Keep it neat: Write clearly, label diagrams, and submit on time. Presentation counts.

For Parents

1. Be a guide, not a doer: Help with ideas and materials, but let the child complete the work.
2. Create a study space: A quiet corner with supplies reduces distractions.
3. Encourage curiosity: Ask "why" and "how" questions instead of giving answers directly.
4. Balance is key: Mix HHW with outdoor play, reading, and family time. Summer should still feel like summer.
5. Celebrate effort: Praise completion and creativity, not just perfection.

Bonus tip: Take a photo of finished homework. It's a nice summer memory and helps if anything gets misplaced.

Instructions for Holiday Assignments.

•Subject-wise Instructions

Homework for **all the subjects** should be completed as per the **specific instructions** provided for each subject.

•Proper Labeling

The **scrapbook** should be **neatly labeled** with the student's **name, class and section**. Ensure that the details are written clearly and legibly on the cover page.

•Systematic and Neat Presentation

Homework should be completed **systematically** and in a **neat, organized manner**.

•Assessment Criteria

The homework will be assessed on the basis of **neatness, originality of ideas** and **overall effort**. Please ensure your work is carefully executed and presented.

•Handwriting Practice

Please complete a page of **handwriting practice** in both your **Hindi** and **English handwriting notebooks**. This will help improve the clarity and neatness of your writing.
