The programme concluded on a happy note with smiles, laughter, and appreciation from all the parents

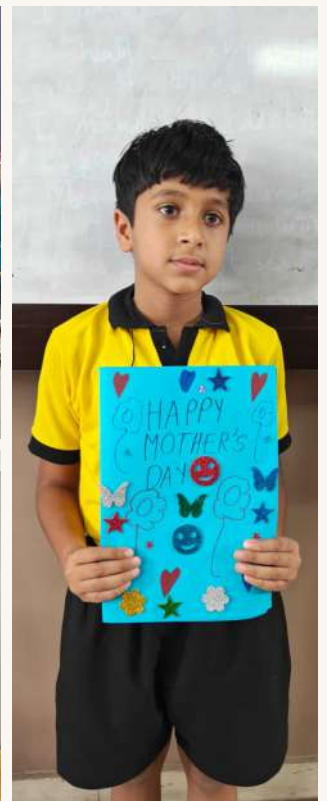


Middle Wing : 09-05-2026
